#### Enrolment Scheme

Matapu School is experiencing steady roll growth. With reference to our site and building capacity, the Matapu School Board of Trustees is intending to implement an enrolment scheme because of the concern about the risk of overcrowding at our school. We have had informal consultations with our neighbouring schools and the Ministry has now approved our intention to commence the formal consultation process with our community. This letter to you is part of the process.

Below there is a proposed map of our enrolment scheme home zone. All students who live within the home zone (inside the outlined area within the map) shall be entitled to enrol at Matapu School.

#### Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in the Hawera Star. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

- First Priority This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary of Education.
- Second Priority Will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.
- Third Priority Will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.
- Fourth Priority Will be given to applicants who are children of former students.
- Fifth Priority Will be given to applicants who are either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.
- Sixth Priority Will be given to all other applicants.
